rapports and cases or images of interest are welcomed. The JEVTM is a unique platform for multidisciplinary work on hemodynamically unstable patients and we encourage all medical professions, both experienced and less experienced, to get involved!

Intense work on building different committees to facilitate collaboration between trauma, general, vascular, orthopedics, OBGYN, IR, ICU and ED professions on these issues. 


"No ego, just good science and cooperation"

Last, but not least, the EVTM textbook has now been released. This is a collaboration with the World Society of Emergency Surgery's (WSES) Acute Care and Trauma Surgeons group where the book is part of the series "Hot Topics in Acute Care Surgery and Trauma". It focuses on

summarizing what is known and "how to actually use" the various endovascular methods for resuscitation and trauma management. It will help readers understand basic and advanced modern techniques for bleeding control and modern resuscitation, and how to apply them in clinical practice.
